## *MCAT 2008*

Thanks for perusing another great year of outstanding programs provided by Missoula Community Access Television. MCAT has provided program services to 61 civic and nonprofit groups this year. 167 programs were produced and 242 hours of new shows were added to the channels. If these 61 groups were to purchase what MCAT has donated the cost would be about \$42,750. Since the Media Assistance Grant program began, MCAT has donated \$686,475 in-kind to local groups. The MCAT community bulletin board served 114 groups with messages and announcements this year.

There is some great programming here across a very wide range of concerns. There is a fashion show, there are several parades: for the Irish, for holiday season, for workers' rights, for banking fairness, for human rights, for alumni of the University. There are amazing lectures on the environment, international relations, local history, fine art, health issues, US foreign policy, and the Missoula economy. There are great performances, in theater, dance and music. There are candidates' forums, business forums, and health forums. Bresnan Communications and the Montana Broadcasters' Association teamed with MCAT to make a series of House and Senate candidate interviews.

On MCAT, you can see a lot of the Missoula community from many different angles. MCAT began a new program of providing service to area nonprofit arts institutions, particularly the Missoula Museum of Art and the University Center gallery and soon the Museum of Arts and Culture on the University of Montana campus. The programming presents a glimpse of the exhibitions offered by the museums and galleries and includes some gallery talks, lectures, and interviews with the artists.

MCAT re-designed the website – [www.mcat.org](http://www.mcat.org) – to provide a searchable schedule for both channels 7 and 11. MCAT began streaming both channels through the website so viewers can watch MCAT when they are not on a Bresnan cable connection. On-demand video streaming will begin later this year.

MCAT added more coverage of City and County government. Transportation Planning Committee and Transportation Technical Advisory Committee meetings, County Board of Adjustment, City Board of Adjustment and Design Review Board and City-County Health Board are now regular cablecast. For a complete report on MCAT's government activity, see our annual Civic Television report.

Christian Ackerman, MCAT public trainer and mentor, worked with teachers and students in all four area high schools and with younger kids at some smaller schools, including Potomac and Sunrise Schools. MCAT continues to provide coverage of the Missoula County School Board and Missoula County Public School education related meetings like Finance and Operation, Teaching and Learning, Personnel, Policy and Negotiations. MCAT gives parents and the community a look at student accomplishments through our coverage of assemblies, concerts and showcases.

The Five Valley Central Asia Institute along with the American Association of University of Women presented a background on the efforts of Greg Mortenson and the Central Asia Institute to build schools for young people in Afghanistan and Pakistan. While not overseas half the year, Mortenson, 50, lives in Montana with his wife, Dr. Tara Bishop, a clinical psychologist, and two children.

Part of the program involves "pennies for peace," which encourages the donation of pennies for building schools for young people in these troubled areas. This program includes a lesson in Pakistan geography from Fozia Naseer, a Pakistani woman who is being educated in Montana. A question and answer session follows the presentation. I would like to inform people that MCAT has had a productive run with its mentor program for a few years now and continues to be very successful working with the public schools in Missoula and with people that are aspiring television producers. I've worked with a number of students on their senior video projects from Sentinel, Hellgate, Willard, and Big Sky High Schools. Also, I have worked with the Girl Scouts 400 this year in filming their short television show. When working with the kids, I teach them the basic production methods to aid in completing their projects and break down the technical aspect, making a non-intimidating work environment. I've worked closely with Sentinel and Big Sky High School Drama/Film classes by teaching them studio production techniques and Digital Editing. This program works with the kids by bringing them into a real television station and giving them technical experience that they can take with them after graduating. I have seen students in this program developing their skills and creating new ones. It has been a pleasure working with all the schools and sharing the knowledge of video production work with them.

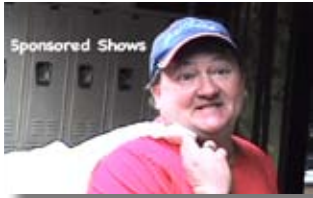
